

Bus Safety is a TEAM effort!!!

Bus Safety Rules

1. Arrive at the bus stop 5-10 minutes ahead of time.
2. Don't cross the road until the school bus arrives.
3. Wait until the bus comes to a complete stop and the door is fully open.
4. Watch for the bus driver's signal that it's safe to cross.
5. Look left, right, and left again for traffic.
6. Cross the road in front of the school bus and ahead of the extended crossing arm. NEVER cross the road BEHIND the school bus!
7. Board the bus quickly and safely and always use the handrail.
8. Place anything you are carrying on your lap or on the floor at your feet.
9. Remain seated and face forward.
10. No eating, drinking, smoking or vaping.
11. Be kind, no hitting or bullying.
12. Speak softly.
13. Do not damage the school bus.
14. Do not use obscene language.
15. Do not throw objects.
16. Respect the property of others.
17. Help keep the bus clean.
18. Never reach for anything underneath a school bus.
19. REMEMBER: THE SCHOOL BUS DRIVER IS THE BOSS OF THE BUS!

SCHOOL BUS TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

School Year 2020-2021

The first day of kindergarten is a huge milestone, and for some children, it comes with climbing those big black stairs to ride the school bus. The process can be intimidating for both you and your child. Getting prepared and making the experience a positive one will make the transition much smoother and more enjoyable.

Students may be asked to walk a reasonable distance to and from a centralized bus collection point. Having students walk to a central stop greatly reduces bus ride times. It is a parental responsibility to assist their child to/from the bus collection point.

Please note that the bus collection time and location for morning pick up and afternoon drop off is subject to change at any time due to student movement within the system.

It is suggested that all students arrive at the bus collection point 5-10 minutes earlier than the scheduled stop time to avoid delays on the route. All bus collection points must be approved through Transportation Services.

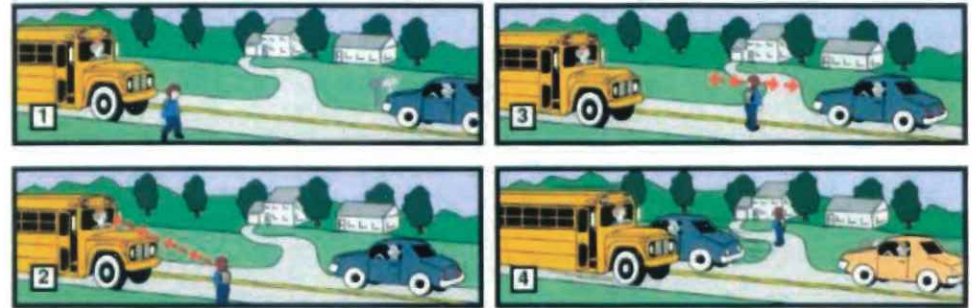
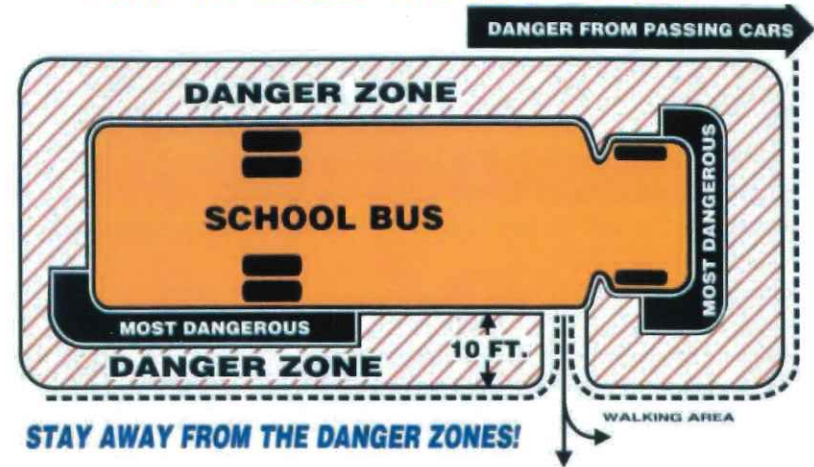

THINGS TO REMEMBER FOR THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

Make sure your child knows the plan for getting to and from school and what happens after school. Here are some things to consider:

- Does your child know what to do if he or she gets lost?
- Does your child know what bus number(s) they are to travel on?
- Does your child know whether to come home or go to an after school program or babysitter after school?
- If you are not home after school, does your child know who will be responsible for him or her, what the rules are, and how to get help in an emergency?
- Have you reviewed safety precautions with your child regarding traffic and strangers?
