We accept cash and cheque. Cheques can be made payable to Southern Kings Consolidated School. If any books are sold out that you wish to purchase, you can order it with payment, and it will be delivered to the school.

MILK AND DRINKS:

We will be offering milk in the vending machine starting on Nov 1st. Depending on weekly usage, we hope to be able to continue with this during the school year. The machine has been moved to the front lobby (by music room) to make it easier for students to access it.

Pricing will be as follows:

White and choc milk 1%, 237 ML – \$1.00 Choc milk 1%, 473 ML – \$2.00 Bottle water, 591 ML – \$1.50 Minute Maid juice, 355 ML – \$2.50

We ask that parents do not send energy drinks, sports drinks or pop with their children to school. These are not permitted in class.

LOCKDOWN DRILL:

We will be having our 2nd practice lockdown drill on Mon, Nov 6th at 8:40 am (after announcements). An RCMP officer may or may not be present for this. This is to ensure our practice meets the required standards.

CHRISTMAS DONATIONS:

SKC has decided that in lieu of a classroom student gift exchange, we would raise funds to help some SKC families in need at Christmas (which will remain confidential). Staff will gather funds, purchase gift cards and a few other items to help those families have a memorable, and easier holiday. If you wish to contribute, families can make a voluntary monetary donation. Students/parents may give the donation to their homeroom teacher or to Afton in the office. DOOR LOCKING SYSTEM:

Our door locking system has been fixed. There is a camera and locking mechanism on the main door (door#1). After 9:00am in the morning, you will need to press the button on the little block box, which rings the doorbell. Someone in the main office will unlock the door manually. We also have the wheelchair access feature attached to this for when it is required. This is a safety addition that many other schools have; it prevents people from entering the school without a staff member knowing and can be helpful for less disruption to classes. While we understand this will be a learning curve, it will be wonderful to have an extra layer of security added to our busy school.

Prior to 9:00am, staff and students can enter through door #2 without having to press the doorbell. This makes the morning traffic flow more easily and allows staff time to get settled. After 9:00am, school doors are locked during the school day, which is a recommendation from the RCMP for all schools. If you have questions, please do not hesitate to call the office at 902-962-7400. MUSIC UPDATES:

Rock band (Gr 6-8) started on Oct 18th and will meet at 1st recess every Day 3. This is for fun, regardless of music abilities. Choir (Gr 3-8) started on Oct 20th. They will meet at 1st recess every Day 1 and 5.

CLOTHING & FOOTWEAR:

We do have a lost & found table setup in the front lobby. We encourage you to ask your child to look here regularly for missing items. We will have everything on display for parents to check out during parent teacher interviews as well. Any unclaimed items will be donated periodically.

MS. MILLER'S LEADERSHIP CLUB (Gr 4-8):

Leadership Club meets every Day 2 in Ms. Miller's class working on different projects and jobs around the school. The idea behind Leadership Club is to help students feel a sense of purpose at school. There are different groups and responsibilities that they can take on to help make our school a better place! For example: There are students who are "playground pals" who help children during recess time in the younger grades. There are "lunch time helpers" who help younger students at lunch time with warming up their food, opening wrappers, cleaning up spills, refilling water bottles, or just chatting with them while they eat lunch. There is a "Positivity Group" who create posters to put up around the school to make it feel more welcoming and inclusive. We are even looking into a "Peer Helping" group for older students to help younger students with their work, if they have some spare time in their day at school. There will be lots of other leadership opportunities as we progress through the year!

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION FOR 2024-2025:

Parents are asked to register their children for Kindergarten (2024-2025) prior to or during the week of November 20-24, 2023. Children must be 5 years old by December 31, 2024, in order to be eligible for Kindergarten in September 2024.

Parents are asked to register their child at their local elementary school during school hours. If you are unsure of your school zone, please call the Stratford Office at (902) 368-6990 or

Summerside Office at (902) 888-8400 or toll-free at 1-800-280-7965.

A registration form will be completed at the time of registration. Parents are reminded to bring a piece of Government issued ID verifying proof of child's age, such as a birth Certificate, PEI health card or passport. Verification of home address must also be provided, such as a current utility bill.

Welcome to Kindergarten sessions for incoming students and their parents will be held at schools in the spring of 2024.

THE REPORT IT! CAMPAIGN:

The Public Schools Branch and its schools work together with students, families and the community to create learning environments that are welcoming, supportive and safe for students.

On October 18th, the PSB launched Phase 2 of the Report It! Campaign pilot in all PSB schools. This campaign, co-developed with students, aims to empower students to report school-related incidents that are impacting them negatively and ensure they can do so in a manner that is most comfortable for them. Feeling welcomed, supported and safe at school creates a positive environment for students to learn and develop.

The Report It! campaign reinforces students informing their parent/guardian, teacher, school counsellor, principal or trusted adult when an incident occurs, and support is needed. Students identified that they wanted the option to make a report verbally, in writing or online. The online reporting form is a new way for students to make a report and gives students the option to be anonymous. Many jurisdictions across the country have successfully implemented this type of reporting option.

Posters and other promotional materials highlight the key messages of the campaign and contain a QR code which accesses the Report It! website and online form directly.

This Spring feedback will be sought from students, staff, parents/guardians and other stakeholders so successes and challenges can be identified, and improvements can be made.
