EMMA'S CUPBOARD:

Emma's cupboard was established in 2011 in memory of Emma Leanne Crossman. Emma was a student at SKC who passed away in June 2011. The cupboard was started by her parents (Jud and Karen) in response to donations received at the time of her passing. Thanks to ongoing support, it has been thriving ever since.

This cupboard contains non-perishable (peanut-free) food items that are used if a child is hungry, does not have a lunch, or needs an extra snack. This is made possible with monetary

donations by community members. The cupboard is used daily. If you wish to donate at any time, please contact the school to arrange the drop-off. Currently, we can take cash or cheque.

FIRE AND LOCKDOWN DRILLS:

The school will have 4 fire drills before the middle of October to ensure familiarity with the process for all students. Parents will also be informed prior to a lockdown and/or evacuation drill in the Fall.

WATER BOTTLES:

Please be reminded to send a water bottle with your child each day. Fountains are no longer in use. We have bottle filling stations that students have access to.

DENTAL PREVENTATIVE CLINIC – STARTING SEPT 11TH:

Purpose of Dental Clinic: Screen children to assess risk of oral disease; provide oral health education, topical fluoride, scaling/polishing and sealants, according to your child's individual needs.

Screening: All children will be seen for a two-minute screening to determine their risk of oral disease. If you do not wish your child to have this dental screening, please notify the school secretary or classroom teacher.

Consent: After the screening, all children will be given a consent form which will be necessary for you to complete and return before services are provided.

Fees: There is no cost involved as the preventive services are covered by the School Dental Care Program.

Contact: If you have any questions about the program, please contact the dental staff at the School or the Dental Public Health Clinic in Charlottetown at 902-368-4918.

Further Information: Please note that only preventive services will be provided, and the screening is not a substitute for an annual dental examination. It is strongly recommended that parents take their children to a dentist for regular examinations and treatment. The

Provincial Dental Care Program assists with the cost of basic dental care delivered in private and public dental offices. For more information, please

RECEPTION AND ITEM DROP OFFS:

When parents or guardians are dropping off students in the morning, <u>please refrain from walking</u> <u>the child to the classroom</u>. If you are dropping something off to your child throughout the day, please check in with the office first. The admin assistant can call the child down to the office to meet you. We appreciate your cooperation with this.

FORMS AND HOMEWORK BAGS:

Please check your child's homework bags/backpacks in the evenings during the first week of school. We will be sending home many important forms that need to be read, signed, completed, and returned to the teacher as soon as possible. This information is critical in

helping us learn the best ways to reach you in the event of an emergency, or early school closure. We also need this information to learn about our students who have special needs, and allergies.

If there is ever a change to your child's pick-up/drop-off arrangements, you need to send a note to the teacher, or call the school. <u>DO NOT SEND THESE CHANGES VIA FACEBOOK.</u> Thank you for your cooperation with this!

WHEN NOTES AND CALLS ARE REQUIRED:

We require written notes/calls from parents for the following reasons; we appreciate your cooperation.

1. Absenteeism

Parents are required to notify the school by phone call in the morning if your child will be absent or late that day. Due to the way absences are recorded in Power school, we may need to ask for the reason of the absence (ex: sickness, appointment, etc.)

2. Remain indoors for recess

If you require your child to remain indoors for recess for a specific reason (injury, for example), please send a note to school.

3. Leaving school during school day or arriving late.

If your child needs to leave during the school day (for a dentist appointment, for example), please send a note to school with your child. If child will/will not be returning to school that day, please indicate. If you forget to send a note, please call the school first thing in the morning.

4. Change of bus transportation.

If there is a change in routine, please send a note to the teacher, and this will be sent to the office. The office will fill in a bus slip and inform drivers.

Aside from parent addresses, bus notes will continue to be limited to childcare

<u>destinations and emergency situations only.</u> Unfortunately, we are not able to provide transportation for after-school activities or events (this includes play dates, sleepovers and birthday parties). This is an island wide, PSB directed request. If you have questions, please call the school office.

STAY INFORMED:

1. Newsletters & Monthly Calendars

This is the first parent newsletter of the school year. On the first day of each month, a new newsletter will be circulated. It will be posted to the school website and will also be emailed to one primary email address. A paper copy will be printed only for those that have communicated to the Admin/Teacher that you do not have an email address, or access to the Internet.

Our website will be used to post current newsletters, staff list information, daily announcements, school calendars, etc. The most current information regarding any school matters will be posted to the website.

3. School Facebook Group:

Feel free to add yourself to our Facebook group, called "Southern Kings Consolidated School". This private group is for immediate family members of current students only (students are not permitted access to this group). When you request to be added, the Admin, Principal, or VP will approve your request. We would like to remind you that Facebook is NOT to be used to communicate bus change requests, pickup changes, or illnesses. Commenting to most posts will be turned off. If you have any questions or concerns regarding any posts, please contact the school directly.

PARKING LOT - DROPPING OFF STUDENTS:

Please notice that the buses will line up to drop off students. We ask that parents drop off students in the drop off lane, let their child out, and let them walk into the school. This will help end traffic entering areas where students are walking into/out of the school. We will have cones placed in the parking lot during the first week of school, and a teacher will be outside to guide walking students.

Please do not drop off students before 8:15 am, as they will not be supervised. Students who are dropped off after 8:15 am will remain in the lobby until the 8:20 bell rings.

MEDICATIONS AT SCHOOL:

If your child requires a staff member's assistance to administer medication at school (puffer, antibiotics, etc.), you must notify the teacher to request a form to be completed and signed by the parent, BEFORE the staff member is allowed to assist.

Staff are not permitted to give medicines like Tylenol, Advil, itching cream, or allergy pills to students. These are not items kept at the school for dispersement. If your child is in need of these types of medicines throughout the school day, they can call home to request some, or they can keep a small dose in their backpack provided the student is capable of knowing how much to take, and when to take it without assistance. Due to potential risk, we kindly ask that you do not send full bottles of Advil or Tylenol to school with your child, in the event they are lost or taken. We appreciate your understanding with this. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact the school.
